PART 2 PRODUCTS Not Used**PART 3 EXECUTION****3.1 STORAGE OF EQUIPMENT OR MATERIALS**

- A. Equipment and/or materials shall not be stored on DISTRICT lands or interest in lands without prior written approval by DISTRICT's General Manager. Storage within DISTRICT lands and interest in lands shall be coordinated to reasonably maintain DISTRICT access to and along District lands and interest in lands.

3.2 CONTAMINATION OF WATER SUPPLY

- A. Water conveyed by the SLA and POMA is used for municipal and industrial water supply. LICENSEE, CONTRACTOR, and Subcontractors shall not introduce pollutants or place foreign materials of any kind in water conveyance facilities.
- B. In the event of a Hazardous Material spill, or if there is any release of materials into the water that may affect the operation of the SLA or POMA, LICENSEE, CONTRACTOR, or Subcontractor shall notify DISTRICT immediately.

3.3 HAZARDOUS MATERIALS, PESTICIDES, POLLUTANTS

- A. Storage, handling, use, or transportation of Hazardous Materials is strictly forbidden on or adjacent to any DISTRICT right-of-way without prior written permission from DISTRICT's General Manager.
- B. All state, federal and local statutes, rules, regulations and ordinances concerning the use of Hazardous Materials, insecticides, herbicides, fungicides, rodenticides, and other similar substances shall be strictly observed.
- C. Prior to the use of Hazardous Materials including insecticides, herbicides, fungicides, rodenticides, and other similar substances on or adjacent to

District rights of way, LICENSEE, CONTRACTOR and Subcontractors shall obtain written approval from DISTRICT's General Manager of a written plan for such use. The plan shall state the type and quantity of material to be used, the pest to be controlled, the method of application, and such other information as may be required. All use of such substances on or near the Aqueduct Corridors shall be in accordance with the approved plan. If the use of a substance is prohibited by the Environmental Protection Agency, it shall not be used. If use of a substance is limited by the Environmental Protection Agency, it shall be used only in accordance with that limitation.

3.4 **DRAINAGE FROM OR ONTO AQUEDUCT CORRIDORS**

- A. Existing drainage over and from Aqueduct Corridors must be maintained at all times. Erosion from construction, operation, maintenance or use activities must be controlled at all times.
- B. No new concentration of surface or subsurface drainage may be directed onto or under the Aqueduct Corridors without a showing of adequate provisions for removal of drainage water, and the specific prior written approval of DISTRICT.
